Commander's Newsletter Input – February 2026

Happy Month!! We are halfway through the Winter and headed toward Spring!! Soon we will see our Snowbirds headed back to the Lake and our Post!! We can't wait to see you again!! As we move into February, we remember the Four Chaplains who died rescuing civilian and military personnel as the American troop ship SS Dorchester sank on 3 February 1943, in what has been referred to as one of the worst sea disasters of World War II. The Dorchester, a civilian liner, had been converted for military service in World War II as a troop transport of the War Shipping Administration. The ship left New York on 23 January 1943, enroute to Greenland, carrying approximately 900 as part of a convoy of three ships escorted by Coast Guard Cutters Tampa, Escanaba, and Commanche. During the early morning hours of 3 February, the vessel was torpedoed by the German submarine U-223 off Newfoundland in the North Atlantic. The Chaplains helped the other Soldiers board lifeboats and gave up their own life jackets when the supply ran out. The Chaplains joined arms, said prayers, and sang hymns as they went down with the ship. These four Chaplains paid the ultimate sacrifice for their fellow Soldiers and Sailors on the Dorchester. What an honor they provided to the men who survived that night and to our Nation!! That is why we pause each 3rd of February to remember them! It should also remind us to treat each other at our Post and in our community with dignity, respect, and kindness! Each of these Chaplains were a different faith...one Catholic Priest, one Jewish Rabbi, one Methodist Preacher, and one Reformed Church Minister. They are somewhat like the four entities at our Post...Legionnaires, Sons, Riders, and Auxiliary. Think how much we could accomplish for our Veterans and Community when our four entities join arms and work together for the good of all!! Each of our members or our Fathers/Mothers/Husbands/Spouses served the Nation when called. Each person at our Post deserves our honor for service to the Nation and now our Post and community!! Let us all remember these Four Chaplains and be kind, thoughtful, caring, and respectful to everyone we meet at our Post!! We can and will make a difference in their lives!!

God Bless you all and may God continue to Bless the United States of America!!
