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### Commander Newsletter Input – August 2026

Happy Month and welcome to the new leadership of your American Legion!! I have spent 44 years in the United States Army and a good deal more studying our history and how we have endured. 2 August 1776 marks 250 years since 56 men sat in a sweltering room in Philadelphia and signed their names to the Declaration of Independence. On this our 250 Birthday, I want to take you back to that room and remind you of what they signed and what it meant for them and for us today. Picture Philadelphia in the summer of 1776. The city sat low along the Delaware River, and by July the heat settled over it like a wet wool blanket that never lifted, day or night. The windows of the Pennsylvania State House were shut tight against spies and eavesdroppers despite the heat, so the men inside debated in heavy wool coats, sweat running down their backs and soaking through linen shirts. Horseflies drawn by the stables nearby got in anyway and buzzed the room all afternoon. There was no air conditioning, no ventilation, no relief of any kind, only candlelight after dusk, the scratch of quill on parchment, and the low murmur of 56 men arguing, sentence by sentence, over the future of a country that did not yet legally exist. Some of them had ridden for days on horseback to reach that room. Some had left wives managing farms alone and children they would not see again for months. When they finally put their names to that parchment, they were signing a document the British Crown would call a confession of treason, and in 1776, treason carried one sentence. There was no institutional safety net waiting to catch any of them if the Revolution failed. There was a trial before a Crown Court, a rope, and a family left behind to answer for it. They signed anyway. These were not reckless men chasing glory but serious men who had studied history before they went out and made it. James Madison spent years poring over the collapse of ancient confederacies, tracing failures all the way back to Greece and Rome, before he ever wrote a single clause of what would become the Constitution. He refused to guess at a system of government when history had already run the experiment and recorded the results in painstaking detail. The Founders read Cicero and Polybius by candlelight so they would not repeat the mistakes that buried the Roman Republic centuries earlier. They deliberately built a Constitutional Republic rather than a pure democracy. They understood that unchecked majority rule eventually turns on itself and eats its own. Power was divided deliberately across three branches and two levels of government, so that no single man, no single office, and no single mob could ever gather all of it into one fist. This is why our Nation has endured. These men pledged "their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor" for the future United States that we enjoy today. So, we as an organization embark on a new journey with new leadership in every entity. Please support them with your patience and understanding as they learn their new positions and how best to support our post, its membership, and our community! They stood up, hooked up, and said "Let's Go" for our post and we are extremely grateful to them for their willingness to serve!! I also want to thank the previous leadership team for all of their hard work and long hours making our post thrive over the past year!! We continued the upgrades to our building that were started three years ago and continue to move our presence and impact forward in our community and in support of our Veterans and their families. Thank you to every Legionnaire, Auxiliary, Son and Rider for your support and for your "Can Do" attitude! We are successful because of you!! Finally, because I was an Army Paratrooper and served in the famous 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division, I must mention National Airborne Day coming up in August! 16 August 1940 marked the first official Army parachute jump, validating the innovative concept of inserting United States ground forces behind battle line by parachute. Airborne combat continues to be driven by the bravery and daring spirit of "Sky Soldiers." Often called into action with little notice, these forces have earned an enduring reputation for dedication, excellence, and honor. So, as we move through August and you see that Veteran around the Post who limps or maybe doesn't stand as erect as he or she once did, they may have been an Airborne Trooper! Thank them and every other Veteran you see, from every military service and military job description for their service to the Nation! I thank you all!!

## The History and Purpose of the Honor Guard

Since its founding in 1919, The American Legion has continued the mission of service to God and Country. One of the most visible expressions of that service is the Honor Guard.

Honor Guards were formed from a simple promise: no veteran would be laid to rest without dignity, respect, and military honors. After World War I, Legion posts organized ceremonial teams modeled after military traditions to ensure fallen comrades were properly honored.

Honor Guard members conduct solemn ceremonies reflecting the highest traditions of the United States Armed Forces, including:

Presentation of the Colors

Rifle volleys

Playing of 'Taps'

Folding and presentation of the United States flag

Federal law guarantees military funeral honors for eligible veterans, and Veterans Service Organizations such as The American Legion assist in providing those honors when requested. This ensures every veteran receives the recognition they earned.

Honor Guard service extends beyond funeral details. Members present the colors at schools, parades, Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies, and community events.

Through every folded flag, every note of 'Taps,' and every final salute, the Honor Guard fulfills a sacred promise — that no veteran will be forgotten.

Uniforms are provided.

We average 4–5 honors per month.

Transportation to and from honors is provided.

Training is provided — no prior experience necessary.

More volunteers allow better rotation and flexibility.

Serve when you can — there is no pressure.

## VETERANS DEATH BENEFITS

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) provides several benefits to surviving family members and loved ones of Veterans. These benefits are meant to ease financial burdens and honor the service and sacrifice of our Nation's Veterans.

### VA BURIAL AND SURVIVORS BENEFITS



#### BURIAL ALLOWANCE

A one-time payment of \$2,000 toward funeral and burial expenses for eligible Veterans.



#### PLOT ALLOWANCE

Reimbursement for the cost of a burial plot in a State, territory, or tribal Veterans cemetery.



#### BURIAL FLAG

The VA provides a United States flag to drape the casket or to be given to the next of kin.



#### HEADSTONE OR MARKER

A Government-furnished headstone or marker for the Veteran's grave at no cost.



#### DEPENDENTS' AND SURVIVORS' BENEFITS (DIC)

Monthly tax-free payments to eligible surviving spouses, children, and in some cases, dependent parents.



#### ACCREDITED SERVICE OFFICER ASSISTANCE

Get help applying for benefits from a Veterans Service Organization (VSO) or VA Accredited Service Officer.

## IT IS THE LAW

By law, each Veteran is entitled to have at least two members of their own military service branch present to conduct Military Honors at their funeral. (10 U.S.C. § 3453 – Military Funeral Honors)

If honor guard members from the Veteran's branch are not reasonably available, the Department of Defense must provide members from another branch.

## REQUESTING MILITARY HONORS

Military funeral honors are a dignified way to recognize and show gratitude for a Veteran's service. The U.S. Government provides honors at no cost.

### HOW TO REQUEST MILITARY HONORS

- 1 CONTACT THE FUNERAL DIRECTOR**  
Your funeral director will usually initiate the request with the appropriate military honors team.
- 2 PROVIDE SERVICE INFORMATION**  
Have the Veteran's full name, branch of service, rank, dates of service, and discharge status available. Please provide a copy of the DD Form 214.
- 3 CONFIRM ELIGIBILITY**  
The honors team have been discharged under honorable conditions.
- 4 SCHEDULE AND DETAILS**  
The honors team will confirm the date, time, and location of the service.
- 5 HONORS WILL BE RENDERED**  
A detail will provide a ceremonial folding of the flag and the playing of "Taps."
